Higher education faces significant challenges with the heightened attention on both the quality of instruction and workforce readiness. Employers as external stakeholders have challenged institutions to address deficiencies that impact workforce readiness (e.g., demonstrated knowledge of content areas) and procedural knowledge (e.g., skillfulness; The Conference Board et al., 2006). This workshop reviews the observed deficiencies in the competencies for students in management programs that have implications for curriculum development and assessment. While some lessons already learned will be shared, this workshop is also about generating new ideas and learning from each other. Finally, different teaching techniques and their appropriate use given different student gap profiles is discussed.
